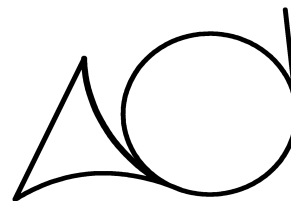

- This WMU faculty ensemble-in-residence presents 20-30 public performances annually. These include formal recitals, public school recruiting recitals/clinics, performances at professional organizations such as the College Music Society, International Trombone Association, International Trumpet Guild, community chamber music societies, universities throughout the nation, and performances on the WMU campus. Since I joined the group, WBQ has performed in the Weill Recital Hall in **Carnegie Hall** in 2013 (premiering a commissioned work by Curtis Curtis-Smith), the **International Trumpet Guild Conference** in Bangkok, THAILAND in 2005, at the **St. Petersburg** and **Schnittke Conservatories** (as well as community concerts in Vologda and Cherepovets) in RUSSIA in 2009, at **Sichuan University** and **Sichuan Conservatory of Music** in

Chengdu, CHINA in 2011; as featured artists with the Kalamazoo Symphony and Fontana Chamber Arts series, in addition to numerous on-campus, community, and nationwide performances. Since 2010, the ensemble has recorded and released three commercial compact discs: *Games for Brass* (**Summit Records**), *For Then and Now* (**Summit Records**), and *Shadowcatcher* (**Klavier Records**). Committed to promoting the composition of significant works for the brass quintet, the ensemble has premiered numerous works in recent years, including *Brass Quintet*, by **Pierre Jalbert**, *Concerto 2010*, by **Anthony Plog**, *A Flying Circus*, by **David Colson**, *Games for Brass* by **Curtis Curtis-Smith**, and *Frame of Mind*, by **Richard Adams**. In 1976 the ensemble premiered *Landscapes* by the Pulitzer Prize-winning composer **Karel Husa**.
